

Stanley Polivick – graduated from Sikeston High School, in Sikeston, MO, then attended Mississippi State University graduating with a BS in Civil Engineering 1980. Stan went to work with Neel-Schaffer Engineers in Bay St. Louis, Ms in July 2008, doing design and construction oversight for Hurricane Katrina recovery projects along the Mississippi gulf coast. However, family concerns prompted a quick return to Sikeston in October 2008. Stan began work with City of Cape Girardeau Public Works in October 2008 as the new Storm Water Coordinator.
